Media Advisory: GCI SchoolAccess and Bering Strait Students Broadcast Native Youth Olympics Live

What: GCI SchoolAccess and the Bering Strait School District have partnered to provide a live broadcast of the Statewide Native Youth Olympics. GCI SchoolAccess has donated a video conference feed and internet bandwidth, allowing the Bering Strait School District Student Broadcasting Team to broadcast the event to district residents and students. The Native Youth Olympics is an athletic competition focused on native games to promote the native culture and a healthy lifestyle to Alaska's youth.

Who: Nearly 400 seventh- through 12th-grade students from across the state will participate in the Native Youth Olympics, including the students from the Bering Strait School District that won the recent local competition. The partnership between the Bering Strait School District and GCI SchoolAccess allows district residents to view a live feed of the event online and district students to watch the event live at their schools. The Bering Strait School District and GCI SchoolAccess frequently partner to broadcast local events.
